You pick up a brochure at the entrance of the bullring and read about the bulls within. Wow, these bulls have weird names. Wait... what's that sound? You see a huge cloud of dust moving towards you, and fast! Run!

## Clues

NOTE: X is in front of Y means that there can be bulls between X and Y .

- The bulls are running in a single line, moving in the same direction, so the front is the 1st bull and the back is the 9th bull.
- Each bull has a (positive) number of medals it has won, with the total number of medals being 35 .
- The number of medals for each bull don't exceed the number of blanks for that bull.
- The bull with 9 medals is in front of bull A .
- Bull D has more medals than Bull I.
- Bull F is adjacent to Bull G.
- Bull H has the same number of medals as the 3rd bull.
- Bull $E$ and the 8 th bull have a different number of medals, and both of them have more than 1 medal.
- There is 1 bull between Bull I and the bull with 3 medals.
- The 6th bull is bull D.
- Bull C and Bull G have 14 medals in total.
- Bull $B$ and Bull $E$ together have the same number of medals as Bull F.
- Bull C is in front of Bull H .
- Bull G is in front of bull I, with 2 bulls between them.
- The bull with 1 medal is the 7 th bull.
- There are 4 bulls between Bull E and Bull I.
- Bull A has 3 medals.
- Bull $D$ has the same number of medals as bull $F$.
